On the fast surface of Greenway Park, Lightning Division 3 ran away with the game against the East Sydney Bulldogs. When last they met, the Bulldogs' strong kicking and marking game saw them easy winners, but at the weekend they were not a match for Lightning's 'in and under' attack on the ball.

Rachael, in her economic fashion, was winning or killing the 50/50 ball.

With the ball brought to ground Emily, Annie and Scarlett came into their own; their clean hands and good delivery by hand and foot from around the pack keeping the ball moving forward and to advantage. Emily, in particular, seemed to be in everything. Once again Samantha's classy outside run was key in pushing Lightning into attack; and, once inside 50, Zahra, Amali and Sarah moved the ball like magicians, with Amali the standout forward for the game finishing with two goals.
