

HBE UNDER 15 vs North Shore Swans Heeney Elimination Final— 17/8/2025 Mike Kenny

Semi-final footy was finally upon us. Personally, I was quite excited about it all so I can only imagine how other parents, players and coaches felt. A lot of these boys have been together for a very long time - some since the very start in Auskick and Under 8s. They're such a tight knit group who thrive on inclusivity and fun - I was so happy to see them achieve some success and play in their second final for the Eagles...

For the match, we had accomplished home final status because of our solid ladder position. Unfortunately, after some shocking weather and Rofe being absolutely trashed in the wet a couple of weeks ago, we didn't get to play at 'The Home of Football'. The fixture had been moved to Mike Kenny Oval which was at least a good, nearby substitute.

The Heeney version of the North Shore Swans were our opponents today and we had performed well against them so far this season. You also never really know who you're actually going to be playing on the day when it comes to facing the bigger clubs.
